I graduated last Spring from Millsaps College with a BS in geology. We finished our baseball season and my baseball career 3rd in the Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference. I have just finished my first year of graduate school at the University of Alabama. This leaves me a year and a half to complete my masters. Believe it or not, I'm teaching three geology labs here at Bama. In the fall I had two CHS alumni in my labs, Lindsay King and Julie Phillips, both did very well. I recently decided on a research topic for my thesis project. I will be spending much of the summer at Lake Shelby near Gulf Shores trying to reconstruct a hurricane history based on sediment and geochemical imprints left by severe storms in Lake Shelby. Basically, a strong hurricane leaves a layer of sand on the bottom of the lake so if we take a core, every layer of sand should represent ancient hurricanes, up to maybe 10,000 years ago. We can

use Carbon 14 dating to date the events. Also, we'll compare what we find against changes in the climate to see if a global warming event affects the activity of hurricanes. This will be valuable information to see if present global warming will increase hurricane activity (insurance companies may change their rates based on our estimate of the changes of hurricanes). Anyway, it will be a lot of fun and you can't beat working at the beach for a good bit of the summer. With my study of geology I've also gotten into photography. Teaching Tips:

Mrs. Hill's and Mrs. Culpepper's 4th grade Alabama History classes have just completed a playdough economics unit. The students studied concepts such as scarcity, opportunity cost, productive resources and capital. The students applied what they learned by assembling goods and services using playdough. For example, the students would make a good or a service using playdough and then barter or trade for other goods. The unit culminated by students assembling hamburgers using playdough and special capital. All had much learning and fun!

Once a month during a "duty-free" lunch period, Mrs. Phurrough holds a Lunch Bunch Book Club Meeting in her classroom. Students bring their lunch or get a take out tray from the lunchroom. Parents volunteer to send a treat such as cookies or brownies. Each student gives a brief report on a book he or she has read. The August Board Meeting scheduled for August 20, 2001 will be changed to August 13, 2001 (immediately following the Public Budget Hearing).

Extended Day Programs:

We are considering (but have NOT made any final decisions) on not having the Extended Day Programs at CCPS, EES and WES. This is a difficult decision. This provides a needed service to parents (and many teachers too). We are going to fully investigate all the variables before we make a decision (revenues, expenditures, quality issues, other available services for after school care and the cost to parents, etc.). I do not want to cause a hardship on parents nor do we want our children to go home unsupervised; however, we are looking at this from every angle (especially financially). Unfortunately, we are forced to make tough decisions.

Old Post Office:

We are attempting to acquire the old post office. City officials and County School officials are working with us to help us acquire this building; they are interested in sharing some of the space with us. **THIS WOULD BE FREE** to Cullman City Schools! Our plan at this time would be to move Central Office and the Alternative School there. The County School System and Juvenile Services would be partners with us in operating the Alternative School. If we were able to acquire the old post office, we would most

likely move late summer or fall. We would consider selling the current Central Office. We are optimistic about this, but this is NOT a “sure thing” by any means.

Old Post Office Update:

We are continuing our plans and “jumping through hoops” to secure the old post office building. If we attain this building (FOR FREE), then we will move our offices as well as Alternative School to this building. We may be able to move Central Office in August. We may have to make a few changes to the building for alternative school and thus may not be able to move this program until late fall or winter. Currently, we contract with Cullman County for this service; however, they would contract with us for this service if we acquire the old post office. We are also considering moving In-School Suspension to this building; however, we would keep these students separate from the long-term/alternative school students.

Proration Hits Cullman City Schools

The following is a letter that was sent out to CCS faculty and staff before the vote on the 12 mill property tax that failed.

Dear Faculty and Staff,

I wanted to update you on our projected State funding for next year. At this time, our State funding reflects a reduction of approximately \$500,000. We basically have a prorated budget. There will also be an additional cost of approximately \$300,000 to us because of PEEHIP (insurance) increasing. We anticipate Federal Funds growing and we hope to gain \$130,000 from this growth; however, this is TBD. We are currently working on a spreadsheet that lists all employees' salaries and step raises (not state raises, but our local salary schedule step raises). This will help us to have a more accurate picture of payroll expenses and thus determine actual cost of payroll for next year. We have been reducing our monthly expenditures substantially thanks to ALL of YOU! I rarely sign purchase orders thanks to your efforts of conserving. We also know that your efforts to conserve on utilities are paying off; however, I do not have exact figures on

this yet (I have not had time to calculate, but will do so in the near future.)

If we get the proposed 12 mills of property tax, this will help us, but we are still on “shaky ground” because we are most likely ending the year with a deficit, our state funding for next year has decreased, and our insurance cost have increased. If we do not get the 12 mills, we will have to make some difficult decisions that we are already discussing. Please keep the Board and myself in your thoughts and prayers. Please continue to educate others about our financial situation. This is a community issue and this is a GREAT community with outstanding schools. We can see by 100% of our seniors passing the Graduation Exam that you are making a difference and preparing our students for the future. Even though we have financial difficulties, we are an outstanding school system and I am VERY proud and honoured to be part of such a dynamic and talented team!
